Charlie has been a superstar this week. He has had a really positive attitude and has worked really hard.

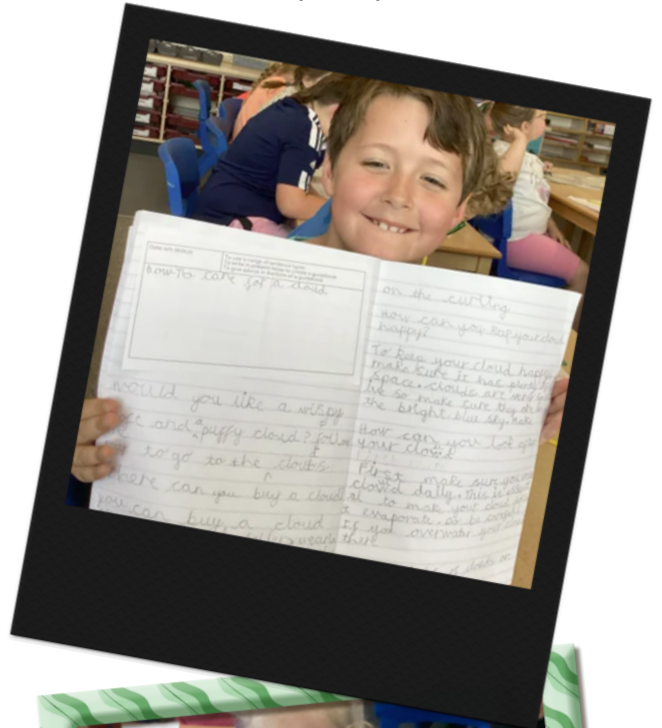


BIRCH
