## **Our Learning**

#### **Nursery**

This week in Nursery, our Enrichment Book of the Week was Colours, Colours Everywhere by Julia Donaldson and Sharon King-Chai, inspiring lots of creative colour exploration and listening for rhyme. We also focused on our Love of Reading sessions with the book Where's Lenny? By Ken Wilson-Max, linking to our hide and seek theme through play, songs, and prepositional language. Outdoors, the children enjoyed den building, developing teamwork and imagination. In Maths, we focused on sorting and grouping activities and sang Five Fat Sausages to support number skills. The children engaged in purposeful play and learning throughout the week, moving, dancing, and markmaking during our Squiggle Whilst You Wiggle sessions. It has been a vibrant week full of curiosity, creativity, and fun learning experiences.

#### Year 1

What a dynamic week of learning in Year 1! We constructed windmills in DT and tested their rotation outside. Our Science exploration focused on observing the changes across the four seasons, helping us understand how our environment shifts through the year.

In Maths, we sharpened numeracy skills, mastering part-whole models and recording addition fact families. Our Writing lessons concentrated on structure, and we're significantly improving our consistent use of capital letters and full stops.

We explored music by defining rhythm and pulse, experimenting with untuned instruments. History took us back to discover life for children in the past. We also learned about various creation beliefs (Christian, Hindu, and Humanist) in RE, and worked on practical strategies in PSHE for solving friendship problems. A productive week!

#### Year 2

It's been a very busy and exciting few weeks! In English, we finished writing our amazing recounts about the Great Fire of London—it felt like we were really there! Now, we're diving into the world of poetry and will soon be writing our own three-line Japanese poems called Haikus.

In Maths, we're moving on from place value and getting to grips with addition and subtraction. We're becoming masters of our number bonds to 10, 20, and even 100 to help us solve problems quickly!

We've also been on some amazing journeys. In Science, we have been discovering all about different habitats, including the rainforest, ocean, and coast. In RE, we learned about Puja and why it's a special way for Hindu families to give thanks. Finally, in History, we've been like time travellers, comparing how schools have changed across the years, looking at the 1900s, 1960s, and our school today!
